# DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR RENEWAL

1. Renewed commitment to Line 3 IAMC *Indigenous Monitoring Program*
2. *Engagement* among Métis Nation leaders, First Nations leaders, Minister NRCan, and CEO CER
3. Support for *expanding L3 IAMC scope* to include all CER regulated projects in the Prairie Provinces
4. *Increased contribution funding*, resources for strong, stable Secretariat and access to expertise

# Line 3 IAMC INDIGENOUS MONITORING

- Continued support for IAMC Indigenous Monitors for oversight of pipeline replacement/decommissioning and operations:
  - Tracking disturbances on right-of-way
  - Documenting evolution of reclamation process
  - Keeping an eye for breaks in the line
  - Support Emergency management response
- Looking ahead – seek increased monitoring activities:
  - Indigenous led inspections
  - Enhance engagement of Indigenous Monitors in decision making

# LEADERSHIP ENGAGEMENT

- While not a forum to advance specific interests of individual Indigenous Nations to be consulted and accommodated with respect to the L3RP, Line 3 IAMC is a forum for engagement between Government of Canada, Canada Energy Regulator and impacted Indigenous Nations.
  - Opportunity for advancing dialogue on complex issues raised in advice to government and regulator.
  - Opportunity for dialogue with proponent – Enbridge
- Senior level engagement among First Nation, Métis Nation leaders, and Minister of NRCan, and Chief Executive Officer for CER to support advancing goal and priorities of the L3 IAMC.

# EXPLORING EXPANDED SCOPE

- The L3 IAMC is well-positioned to support Indigenous Monitoring activities along not just the L3RP, but also all CER regulated pipelines in the Prairie Provinces, expanding its reach beyond the Line 3 corridor.
- Seek support to explore expanding scope of Line 3 – IAMC to include all CER regulated projects in the Prairie Provinces.

# INCREASED RESOURCES

- Seek increased resources to support:
  - Program contribution funding that includes Indigenous Nation participation, Indigenous Monitoring, Emergency Management, Training and Capacity Building and Communication and Engagement
  - Stable Secretariat and engagement of technical expertise as required

## NEXT STEPS

- Confirm recommendations
- Support budget proposal and development of documentation seeking renewed funding commitment from NRCan for the Line 3 IAMC beyond March 2022
